THE LAY OF THE LAND

From local institutions to celeb's faves, start by getting your bearings.

1 HOLLYWOOD FOREVER CEMETERY

Classic flicks such as *Beverly Hills Cop* and *Grease* are projected on a mausoleum wall here on summer nights. cinepia.com

2 FRED SEGAL

Housed in an ivy-covered bungalow on Melrose Avenue, this shopping institution has seen everyone from Matt Damon to Sandra Bullock walk through its doors. fredsegal.com

3 ST. MONICA CHURCH

On a quiet tree-lined street near the beach, this limestone church has plenty of celebrity parishioners. Among them, former Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger and his wife, Maria Shriver, as well as Martin Sheen and Brooke Shields. stmonica.net

4 CHATEAU MARMONT

The stoned property overlooking Sunset Boulevard is where John Belushi famously died of a drug overdose in 1982. chateaumarmont.com

5 ROYAL/T

This whimsical Culver City space is part pop-art gallery, part shop and part Japanese-inspired mad café. royal-t.org

6 PIZZERIA MOZZA

Getting a table at this buzzy pizzeria, owned by Mario Batali, Nancy Silverton and Joe Bastianich, is nearly impossible—unless you're Neil Patrick Harris (or the first lady, who dropped in last summer). mozza-la.com

7 GRIFFITH OBSERVATORY

See stars of a different kind through the Zeiss telescope at this landmark. griffithobs.com

8 HOLLYWOOD ROOSEVELT

As historic as Hollywood, the first Academy Awards were held in this hotel, and some say famous resident Marilyn Monroe still haunts room 246. hollywoodroosevelt.com

9 MAVERICK'S FLAT

The newly renovated Apollo Theatre of the West Coast has been showcasing great funk, R & B and soul music since it opened in 1966. The club even inspired the cover art for The Temptations' 1970 album *Psychedelic Shack*.

10 THE EDISON

A former power plant-turned-swanky lounge, this downtown spot has appeared on cult-favorite HBO show *Entourage* (the one where Vince and gang celebrate closing the deal on *Smoke Jumpers*). edisondowntown.com

11 L.A. LIVE

A case study in successful urban planning, you can stay, eat, watch a Lakers game, hear live music, see a movie and check out the latest exhibition at the GRAMMY Museum, all in one spot downtown. lalive.com
